Barry Fasbender, FCV Member is U.S. Master Swimmer!

DID YOU KNOW THAT: Foster City Village member, Barry Fasbender, at the age of 78, is an award winning US Master Swimmer.

United States Masters Swimming (USMS) was started in 1970 by a doctor for the Navy, who dreamed of adults swimming for fun, fitness and fellowship. Forty five years later his dream has evolved into an organized physical fitness program for over 100,000 adult swimmers around the world. USMS swimmers range in age from 18 to over 110, some of whom are even former Olympians.

At national meets Barry is often still competing against friends that he competed against in high school and college, 50–60 years ago. Barry has achieved many Pacific, All American and National Championship recognitions. Alice didn't start competing in masters swimming until eight years ago at the age of 69. They both now swim for the San Mateo Masters swim team at the College of San Mateo. This is a big team with over 300 members, several coaches, and 24 different workouts a week.

One of Barry's volunteer jobs was Meet Director of the 2006 FINA World Masters Swimming Championship at Stanford. Over 5,000 swimmers from 74 countries participated in the 10 day meet, the biggest swim meet ever held in this country.


Barry is one of the best swimmers in the country in his age group, and in 2008 he won the award that is only given once a year to one person in the nation: the Ransom Arthur award.
