The March Lunch & Learn program hosted by Board of Directors President Supriya Singh and Village Member Murli Melwani, focused on Spring festivals Holi and Diwali.

Holi, the festival of colors, is celebrated by spraying non-toxic, colored powder on each other, which epitomizes the colors of Spring, and respect and love for nature. The presentation included photos of the young and old, covered in a rainbow of colors, from different parts of the world including pictures of Phyllis and Jeff Brown from past celebrations at Leo Ryan Park.

Supriya and Murli explained the Festival of Light, Diwali. "If you were to take a bit of Christmas, a bit of New Year's Eve and a bit of the Fourth of July and roll them all into one, you will get a taste of what it is to celebrate Diwali."

Diwali is celebrated with fireworks and by lighting wicks in lamps. The oil in the lamp stands for our negative tendencies. By lighting the lamp, we are symbolically burning our ego. The light from the lamp removes darkness and ignorance and brings self-awareness and knowledge.

Supriya recalled celebrations in India when she was growing up. The photographs showed how she celebrated Diwali in the States with the colored powder patterns at the entrance of the house, the altar with little lamps inside the home, lighting sparklers, and fireworks with family and friends.

Shari Williams wrote an article for The Islander, describing Holi as the "Festival of Love," adding "famous for being the most colorful festival in the world." She mentioned that Supriya and Murli "gave us an energetic education about Holi" and "Foster City Villagers enjoyed and learned about the Indian Holiday called Holi".
